Applicants will need to complete the accompanying form and submit a 1-3 page letter describing how receiving the scholarship and attending the Kellogg Institute will improve the quality of developmental education practices on his or her campus.

The scholarship will include tuition to the Institute, room and board, and travel expenses, up to a total of \$5,000. The McGraw-Hill Developmental Educator Scholarship will be awarded at the 2015 NADE conference.

Qualifications

- Applicants must have at least a baccalaureate degree from an accredited postsecondary institution.
- Applicants must be an instructor of developmental courses at a community college, career college, or university.
- Applicants must have taught developmental courses for at least one year.

Application Process

Applicants must submit the following documents by January 20, 2015 in order to be considered:

- A resume,
- A letter of recommendation from the chief academic officer or dean at the applicant's institution explaining what benefits the institution expects to obtain as a result of your attendance at the Kellogg Institute and why you are the best person to deliver these benefits, and
- A 1-3 page letter describing how receiving the scholarship and attending the Kellogg Institute will improve the quality of developmental education practices on his or her campus.

The winner must be available to present her or his practicum or similar learning at NADE or similar conference/event at the request and expense of McGraw-Hill.

Selection Process

Applicants will be screened by a selection committee composed of the Director of the National Center for Developmental Education, Director of the Kellogg Institute, and the Director of Developmental English from McGraw-Hill. All applications will be acknowledged and the winner will be announced on February 2, 2015.
